MUNICIPAL PARKS ON THE AIR – UPDATE

WEST CENTRAL FLORIDA SECTION SPONSORING BIKE MS CITRUS TOUR AMATEUR RADIO COMMUNICATIONS.

In early February it was announced that Darrell Davis KT4WX, the Section Manager for the ARRL West Central Florida Section, in agreement with Craig Shapiro N1MSS the logistics coordinator for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and Jason Triolo KD4ACG the amateur radio communications coordinator Bike MS Citrus Tour in 2017, that the West Central Florida Section would provide sponsorship of amateur radio communications for the Bike MS Citrus Tour. Based in the Dade City area of Pasco County, EPARS has a website, a Facebook page, operates two Yaesu System Fusion repeaters on 146.880 MHz (PL 146.2 Hz) and 443.600 MHz (PL 146.2 Hz), which both operate in Automatic Mode Selection with a Wires X node on the 146.880 MHz machine. They meet on the 2nd Saturday of every month, have monthly VE testing, and in 2017 started an annual tailgate hamfest in Dade City.

AMATEUR RADIO PARITY ACT PASSED U.S. HOUSE – STILL BEFORE SENATE COMMITTEE. HUDSON DIVISION DIRECTOR TESTIES IN FAVOR OF BILL:



Update 1/26/18: ARRL Hudson Division Director Mike Lisenco, N2YBB, <u>testified</u> Thursday (January 25) before a session of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation regarding Amateur Radio's readiness to respond in an emergency. In his testimony, Lisenco reminded the panel members that the Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2017 is now pending before the Committee. "[Senate Bill 1534] is a balanced, completely bipartisan bill that

would fully protect both the entitlement of Amateur Radio volunteers to...provide emergency, disaster relief and public service communications, while...protecting the aesthetic concerns and the jurisdiction of homeowners' associations," Lisenco said in his written remarks, noting that the bill is unopposed. "We are in desperate need of this legislation, and without it, the volunteer emergency communications services provided by Amateur Radio will be precluded. We urge the Committee in the strongest terms to please approve and send this legislation forward without delay," Lisenco said. The <u>Amateur Radio Parity Act</u> of 2017 was introduced in the US Senate on July 12, marking another step forward for this landmark legislation. Senators Roger Wicker (R-MS) and Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) are the Senate sponsors. The measure will, for the first time, guarantee all radio amateurs living in deed-restricted communities governed by a homeowner's association (HOA) or subject to any private land use regulations, the right to erect and maintain effective outdoor antennas at their homes. The Senate bill, S. 1534, is identical to H.R. 555, which passed the US House of Representatives in January 2017. ARRL President Rick Roderick, K5UR, is calling on League members to urge their US Senators to support the <u>Amateur Radio Parity Act</u> of 2017, S. 1534. ARRL has opened a <u>RallyCongress page</u> to simplify the task. The <u>Amateur Radio Parity Act</u> of 2017, refiled in the U.S. House or Representatives on January 13, 2017, was passed unusually quickly on January 23, 2017. The Amateur Radio Parity Act will required the FCC to amend its Part 97 Amateur Service rules to apply the three-part test of the <u>PRB-1</u> federal preemption policy to include homeowners association regulations and deed restrictions, often referred to as 'covenants, conditions, and restrictions' (CC&Rs). At present, PRB-1 only applies to state and local zoning laws and ordinances. The FCC has been reluctant to extend the same legal protections to include private land-use agreements without direction from Congress."
