

#### HURRICANE SEASON STARTS 6/01/17 - FINISH YOUR PREPARATIONS FAST:

The 2017 Atlantic Hurricane Season begins this month on June 1, 2017. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration disseminated their hurricane forecast for the 2017 Atlantic Hurricane Season on Thursday May 25th. In the press release, Gerry Bell, Ph.D., lead seasonal hurricane forecaster with NOAA's <a href="Climate Prediction Center">Climate Prediction Center</a> stated, "The outlook reflects our expectation of a weak or non-existent <a href="El Nino">El Nino</a>, near- or above-average sea-surface temperatures across the tropical Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea, and average or weaker-than-average vertical wind shear in that same region,".



Now is the time to be bringing to completion any improvement or repairs to your Go-Kit and be sure to test them. Now is the time to complete the check your inventory of supplies, medicines, water, etc., and you should you check for not only quantity but quality. Do not wait until a storm is bearing down upon you, when the local stores where you normally shop may be out of stock on the items you need.

NOAA just completed their 2017 Hurricane Season awareness webinars that covered the following topics in a series of four seminars on each of the following topics: New NOAA Satellite Capabilities and Tropical Cyclone Research, Storm Surge Warnings and Graphics, NHC and Local NWS Offices Overview of New Products and Services, and Hurricane Inland Flooding – Risks and Warnings. # WEST CENTRAL FLORIDA SECTION FIELD DAY CARAVAN – 6/24/17 INSTRUCTION AND SUGGESTIONS FOR SENDING YOUR FIELD DAY MESSAGE:



Coming up on Saturday June 24<sup>th</sup>, and Sunday June 25<sup>th</sup> will be ARRL Field Day for 2017. The 17<sup>th</sup> annual ARRL West Central Florida Field Day Caravan. Two teams will take to the roads and tour the Section:

- Darrell Davis KT4WX, Section Manager, and Christine Duez KK4KJN, Section Youth Coordinator will tour Polk, Pasco, Pinellas, and Hillsborough Counties.
- Ben Henley KI4IGX, Section Emergency Coordinator and Randy Payne K4EZM, Assistant Section Manager will tour Highlands, Hardee, Desoto, Charlotte, Sarasota, and Manatee Counties.

Both teams should be able to complete their tours sometime on Saturday. If you wish a visit from the Field Day Caravan, please register your Field Day operation at the ARRL Field Day site at <a href="http://www.arrl.org/field-day-locator">http://www.arrl.org/field-day-locator</a>. Also during the tour you will be able to track where your Section Manager, Darrell Davis KT4WX, is located during his travels via APRS. He will be running K4WCF-9.

The following is a quote of the criteria from the ARRL Field Day rules for the Field Day message to the Section Manager, "You should include the club name, number of participants, Field Day location, and number of ARES operators involved with your station. The message must be transmitted during the Field Day period and a copy of it must be included in your submission in standard ARRL radiogram or no credit will be given. The message must leave or enter the Field Day operation via amateur radio RF."

Also there are several methods available to you that you may send a message to Darrell Davis KT4WX, your Section Manager, for your Field Day message:

- APRS Instant Message: Send an NTS Radiogram as an APRS Instant Message to K4WCF-9 on Saturday or Sunday. The tracker will be operational for 24 hours from Saturday 6/24/17 at 0900 until Sunday 6/25/17 at 1400.
- Winlink 2000: Send an NTS Radiogram via Winlink 2000 to my email address at kt4wx@arrl.net. Remember you must use a WL2K Client station that originates the message on RF from your site. This method is legal per the Field Day rules.
- Eagle Net Special Session: Saturday June 24, 2017 at 2030 EDT on the NI4CE Repeater System. For repeater frequencies and coverage maps: <a href="http://www.ni4ce.org">http://www.ni4ce.org</a>.
- Regular NTS Traffic Nets on HF: Go to the West Central Florida Section website for a list of the HF Net Frequencies and times that are available during the Field Day period at <a href="http://arrlwcf.org/home/wcf-section-nets/">http://arrlwcf.org/home/wcf-section-nets/</a>.

Remember, the message does not have to be DELIVERED during the Field Day period, only ORIGINATED during the period. It can be delivered after the period and you will still receive the credit. All messages that are received will be acknowledged during or right after the Field Day period.

# CLUB WEBSITE AND NEWSLETTER OF THE MONTH: Tamiami Amateur Radio Club – TARC Communicator



# AMATEUR RADIO PARITY ACT REFILED AND PASSED BY THE U.S. HOUSE AND ON TO THE U.S. SENATE:



**Update 1/23/17**: The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2017, refiled in the U.S. House or Representatives on January 13, 2017, and was passed unusually quickly on January 23, 2017 by unanimous consent and has been passed now to the U.S. Senate for consideration. The previous version, the Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015, died in the U.S Senate on December 9, 2016 primarily due to the opposition of one U.S. Senator: Senator Bill Nelson, one of own Senators from Florida. The ARRL has already been in contact with the sponsors of the bill to allow for an early introduction, which will give more time to obtain success.

The Amateur Radio Parity Act will required the FCC to amend its Part 97 Amateur Service rules to apply the three-part test of the <u>PRB-1</u> federal preemption policy to include homeowners association regulations and deed restrictions, often referred to as 'covenants, conditions, and restrictions' (CC&Rs). At present, PRB-1 only applies to state and local zoning laws and ordinances. The FCC has been reluctant to extend the same legal protections to include private land-use agreements without direction from Congress."
