# WINTER FIELD DAY - JANUARY 25-26, 2020 By Frank Wroblewski, W2XYZ

Everyone who has had his license more than a day or two knows of the ARRL Field Day in June. A few years ago several Hams in the Midwest started a new event, Winter Field Day. Somewhat surprisingly, Winter Field Day (WFD) is catching on.

Our club, [Tamiami Amateur Radio Club] participated for the first time last year. We operated from North Jetty Park with two transmitters. We made 182 phone contacts, 0 CW and 0 digital.

This event has three categories, Indoors, Outdoors, and Home. We entered the Outdoor category and of the 230 stations registered as Outdoors, we placed 91st.

We plan to enter the WFD event again this year. WFD begins at 2 pm EST Saturday Jan 25 and runs for 24 hours until Sunday Jan 26 2 pm EST. We intend to operate Outdoors at the Coast Guard station; however, in case of inclement weather such as last year, we"II move indoors and adjust our category accordingly. We'll run two 500 watt transmitters, one for phone and one for CW. FT8 is not permitted in WFD. Digital modes such as RTTY, PSK31, Olivia, etc. are allowed.

Many of you remember the difficulty we had trying to operate phone or CW last June at Field Day due to overloading of the receivers from the FT8 stations. We are going to use WFD as a learning opportunity to avoid that same problem next June. Although FT8 is not permitted in WFD, we will set up a FT8 station and operate it independent of the WFD activities. This will give us a chance to try some of the ideas members have in configuring the stations to avoid or eliminate the overloading of the receivers.

A planning meeting will be held in January (date TBD) and all are invited to bring their ideas and suggested solutions for our dilemma to the meeting. Think about antenna layout, antenna types, equipment, and methods of physical separation.

Volunteer registration opened on the www.citrustour.org website on October 8th. We already have 16 volunteers confirm that they will be here for the event. As usual we need as many amateur radio volunteers as we can get. Amateur radio volunteers provide all route support from communications to transporting cyclist who have mechanical issues or just can't make it any further on their own.

The routes will be almost identical to last year. We will be out and back to the Omni Resort at Championsgate both days with four routes (20, 50, 75 & 100 mile) heading to the south toward Frostproof on Saturday and three routes (20, 50

& 75 mile) heading toward Polk City & Haines City on Sunday. There will be some minor route changes from last year as they try to eliminate a few hills.



If you are interested in Emergency Communications this event is excellent practice as we run two fully directed nets and

handle routine, priority and emergency traffic. A lot of our volunteers have been working this event for over 10 years and some come from as far away as Miami.


If reports are not received after a period of time, the Station Appointment will be cancelled for lack of activity. Your cooperation in filing your monthly reports is appreciated.



# VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO ACTIVATE K4WCF SPECIAL EVENT STATIONS FOR 20TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF THE WCF SECTION.

The Section will be holding a ARRL West Central Florida Section 20th Anniversary Operating Event special operating event to commemorate the 20th Anniversary of the ARRL West Central Florida Section. As part of this celebration, K4WCF, the callsign of the West Central Florida Section, will be activated one weekend in each county of the West Central Florida Section until all ten counties are activated over a period of ten weekends. A K4WCF operation was done in January of 2000 when the West Central Florida Section commenced operation. This will be repeated once or twice more later during the year, either in the fall and or the summer and fall, to give everyone an opportunity to work K4WC in all ten counties. This will not be a contest but simply an operating event to celebrate the anniversary of the West Central Florida Section.

The West Central Florida Section is now taking applications for ARES and or ACS groups, CERT groups, or radio clubs to apply to be authorized to activate K4WCF for a weekend at a time for each respective weekend. A special event web page on the Section website will be setup once the rules are finalized. The following is the tentative schedule of operating weekends for the first running of K4WCF in the Winter and Spring of 2020 and the groups, clubs, or individuals who have volunteered to operate K4WCF:

- Manatee County: 1/18/20 and 1/19/20
- Sarasota County: 1/25/20 and 1/26/20
- Charlottle County: 2/01/20 and 2/02/20
- Desoto County: 2/15/20 and 2/16/20

- Highlands County 2/22/20 and 2/23/20
- Polk County: 2/29/20 and 3/01/20
- Hardee County: 3/14/20 and 3/15/20
- Pasco County: 3/21/20 and 3/22/20
- Pinellas County: 3/29/20 and 3/30/20 -St.Petersburg Amateur Radio Club.

The publication of the WCF Section 20th Anniversary Operating Event page and the schedule of who is going to operate will be announced by future WCF SECTION PRESS RELEASES and in the January WCF PRESSER. Groups interested in operating K4WCF in a particular county please use the Contact Form on the Section website to apply. Please state on the Contact Form the name of your organization, where you would activate K4WCF, and for what county you are volunteering to activate. The criteria for operating K4WCF is two fold:

(1) A station operating K4WCF must be located in the county it is activating.

(2) Have the capability to hand out contacts on VHF and UHF so that our Technician class licensees can participate by making contacts as well.

K4WCF may be operated either portable, from a club station, an EOC station, or a base station.

# Yahoo Groups Shutdown has Ham Radio Interest Groups Seeking to Save Content

Yahoo Groups, which has hosted a considerable number of ham radio interest groups over the years, is shutting down. All previously posted content on the site became unavailable in mid-December, but Yahoo is processing requests to download content until January 31, 2020. Yahoo also has provided group administrators ("admins") a way to export data ahead of that deadline. Groups will continue to live on in some limited fashion, but all groups will become private, and nearly all of the functionality that made them popular in the first place will disappear.

Around since 2001, Yahoo Groups, now owned by Verizon, has provided online repositories of communications and information on a wide variety of specialized subjects and activities, including Amateur Radio. Yahoo Groups for nearly every radio have been established, where owners could exchange information and ask questions. Other groups on the Yahoo platform offered a watering hole for those interested in a particular ham radio activity as well as for those who want to buy and sell gear and components. Some clubs and ham radio logging software users have taken advantage of Yahoo Groups.

New platforms such as Groups.io, Facebook, and Google are looking to assume the role that Yahoo Groups is stepping away from. Groups.io charges fees to migrate content onto its platform, however, and Facebook and Google lack the ability to import content at all. With Groups.io as the most likely successor platform, many admins have assumed the migration expense and relocated group content so it would not be lost. Not all groups have been as fortunate, however, putting them into the position of starting from scratch and losing years of conversations, files, polls, and data.

Web application developer Andy Majot, K5QO, of Sellersburg, Indiana, took the initiative to download archives of Yahoo Groups devoted to individual ham radio gear and uploaded them to his personal website.

"I hope to have them hosted in perpetuity for future hams to use," Majot told ARRL. "It should be noted that I backed up groups regardless of whether they are living on in other platforms; I wanted to snapshot the groups as they were on Yahoo prior to their deletion." Majot noted that several of the groups he has archived have already migrated their content to Groups.io, but many more have not.

Majot said an organization called Archive Team is helping to save as many Yahoo Groups as possible and has been backing these up since the closure announcement in October, but, Majot said, progress has nearly halted since Yahoo cut off access to many group features in mid-December.

Majot invited those seeking to relocate Yahoo Groups archives to contact him. "I would be happy to host these files, alongside my other archives," he said. — Thanks to Andy Majot, K5QO
