#### **SECTION MANAGERS MUSINGS**

Welcome to the April issue of the WCF PRESSER. Since I last wrote to you, many things in our everyday lives has changed, have changed very rapidly, and in some cases almost daily. This time last month we had heard about the coronavirus, or COVID-19 as it is unofficially named, and in Florida we only had a handful of cases. Now one month later, as I write this, we have almost 8.000 cases statewide and that count has been going up approximately 800 cases per day for the last week. As a result everyone has been requested by the White House and the U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention to practice "social distancing". Just yesterday Wednesday April 1st, Governor Ron Desantis issued Executive Order 20-91, which ordered all Florida residents to "stay at home" except for travel for "essential services" or "essential activities", which include worship, recreational activities, care of pets, and



helping a friend or loved one, all with social distancing practices being observed. Even most churches and or places of worship have canceled public services and are doing virtual services by on-line video and or audio streaming, including my own church. I have been off from work, driving a school bus, and mostly at home since Friday March 13th. | have only been traveling when I need to go get groceries and supplies for Mom and myself, and to go to our church on Sunday and Wednesday to do our virtual service by on-line video/ audio streaming, since we are not having public services right now to comply with

the request from White House and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

This has impacted amateur radio as well. Even before this latest executive order all hamfests, most radio club meetings, and other radio related get togethers had been canceled. Now with the new executive order, all in person amateur radio gatherings will have to be canceled for the month of April. Even Daytfon Hamvention was canceled in mid-March for the first time in its history. However now is the time amateur radio can shine. Many radio clubs are doing either virtual meetings via Zoom or other videoconferencing technology, or are doing "on the air" meetings. I have seen amateur radio activity increase significantly during the month of March. Radio contests, including the Florida QSO Party, are going forward. Since most of us are now "homebound" we have the opportunity to do some of the following: (1) Work on that next radio related construction and or modification project which could include an improvement on your base station and or ARES Go-Kit. (2) Take some more on-line courses, including those ICS courses that you may need for ARES, ACS, or CERT. (3) Participate in radio nets, ragchews, DX, and maybe even a contest. (4) Catch up reading some articles that you may have missed in QST, QEX, NCJ, or On The Air magazine. These activities will help you to prevent getting "cabin fever" and keep you sharp mentally. Also you will get an opportunity to catch up on some family time that you will never regret. Do not forget when you do go out, to continue to practice your social distancing which is staying 6 feet apart from others, washing your hands often, and using hand sanitizer when you cannot wash your hands. Roy provided great leadership for Hillsborough County ARES/RACES and great service to the amateur radio community. He will be missed by all who new him."

## SECTION ARES MEETING FOR SPRING 2020 AND APRIL 2020 TARCFEST CANCELED

Ben Henley KI4IGX, our Section Emergency Coordinator, has canceled the Spring 2020 ARRL West Central Florida Section ARES Luncheon and ARRL West Central Florida Section ARES Meeting both scheduled for Saturday April 11, 2020 in Sarasota County.

This cancellation is due in keeping with guidelines issued by the White House and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to reduce the spread of COVID-19. The next scheduled Section ARES Luncheon and Section ARES Meeting will be on Saturday July 11, 2020.

Biff Craine K4LAW, one of our Assistant Section Managers, relayed the following information from the Tampa Amateur Radio Club, "TARCFest has been held in April since its beginning but will be canceled this April due in part to park closure and our inability to provide a responsible event that would not contribute to efforts to stem the spread on COVID-19. This action is consistent with other tailgates from Dayton to Zephyrhills." The next scheduled TARCFest will later in the year in August.

#### **NEW EMERGENCY COORDINATOR FOR HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY ARES/RACES APPOINTED**

On Monday March 30, 2020, Bill Miller N1CDO, was appointed as the ARRL **Emergency Coordinator for Hillsborough** 

County ARES/RACES due to the declining health of Roy Drury K4DCT, who subsequently passed



away on Wednesday April 1, 2020.

Miller, first licensed in 1980, has been extensively involved with ARES and MARS since he was licensed.

After retiring from a career with the United States Navy, Miller moved to Ruskin, to be close to his parents, where he became involved with Hillsborough County ARES/RACES serving as the Assistant Emergency Coordinator for HF operations and most recently as the executive Assistant Emergency Coordinator.

Miller is also involved with the Kings Point Amateur Radio Club serving as a volunteer examiner and taking care of several repeaters. Miller also has been providing service for several years with the annual Blke MS Cltrus Tour. Miller is also an ARRL Life Member.

Miller in his professional career served in the United States Navy, having served in numerous locations and had been an Electronics and Operations instructor.

#### FLORIDA ARES TASK BOOK NOW AVAILABLE

The Florida **ARES Task** Book is now available for download from the West Central Florida Section ARES webpage

The Florida ARES Task Book, originally adopted from the ARES Task Book created by the ARRL South Texas Section, has been compiled for use in the entire State of Florida by all three ARRL Florida Section ARES organizations. The three ARRL Florida Section Emergency Coordinators worked together on the compilation of the Florida ARES Task Book, and received numerous inputs from the ARRL Emergency Coordinators in all three ARRI Florida Sections.

The Florida ARES Task Book is intended for amateur radio operator s who have made themselves available for deployment outside of their own county of residence for a mutual aid response in times of disaster, when such mutual aid is requested by a served agency.

The ARES Task Book is a concept first introduced in the new ARRL ARES Plan which came into effect in January 2019.

#### FLORIDA QSO PARTY SCHEDULED FOR 4/25/20 AND 4/26/20

The Florida Contest Group has announced the Florida QSO Party will be held this year as scheduled. The Florida QSO Party is scheduled for Saturday April 25, 2020 and Sunday April 26, 2020.




