Welcome to the October issue of the WCF PRESSER. As Jim Weslager K3WR and I were working on getting the September issue prepared for publication, in which I reminded everyone to stay vigilant concerning hurricane season, we had a Labor Day weekend case of "heartburn" with the close call from Hurricane Dorian. All of the ARES organizations were in stand by mode in case their services were required. Some were scheduled in the last days before Labor Day weekend to activate but when Hurricane Dorian made the abrupt turn to north on Labor Day. Highlands County ARES did activate as requested by Highlands County Emergency Management and had ARES



personnel in shelters for about 28 hours. Thankfully, for Florida, Hurricane Dorian did make that turn and we were not impacted here in the ARRL West Central Florida Section but other ARRL Sections were much more impacted than we were. The hardest hit was the northern Bahamas and we need to remember those people in prayer and in our thoughts, as they begin the long road of recovery. There has been some amateur radio assistance provided by some amateur radio operators in

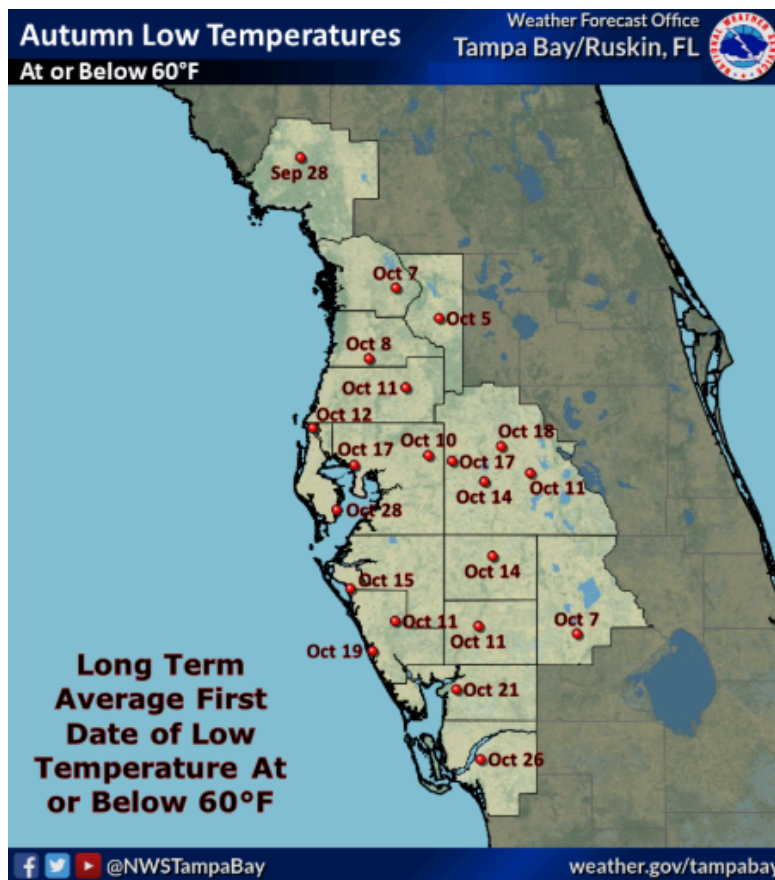

The hurricane season is certainly not over and we have certainly seen an active Atlantic for the whole month of September, which is normal for this time of year. There is often another secondary peak of activity in early October. Remember to continue to monitor the latest advisories and tropical weather outlooks issued by the National Hurricane Center.

Everyone by now is starting to wonder, "When is it going to cool off?". According to the statistics kept by the National Weather Service office in Ruskin, which covers the ARRL West Central Florida Section, on average the first night with temperatures below 60 degrees occurs from October 11 through October 28, going roughly from north to south.

The real cool down does not happen typically until November. So we do have two things to look forward to in November: cooler weather and the end of hurricane season. I am also hoping to put up a 2 Meter 10 or 11 element beam and a 70 centimeter beam to check into more local club or ARES Nets on 2 Meters and or 70 centimeters. I was planning to build a couple unless I run across a 2 Meter and 70 centimeter beams at a hamfest for the right price, as the fall hamfest season is now getting into swing. I look forward to seeing all of you at an upcoming hamfest and of course at the Tampa Bay Hamfest in mid December.

TOM'S TECH TIPS: BACKGROUND APPS THAT STEAL WINDOWS 10 PERFORMANCE

If your computer seems to be slower than it should be, now would be a good time to see what applications are needless-

ly running in the background. It's helpful to have some background apps running, but far too many developers believe that their application should be one of them. It's time to take control of your own computer.

To see what's running open **Settings** and type **background** in the search panel. Choose **Background apps** from the list and you'll probably be amazed by the applications listed there.

Literally dozens of applications were set to run in the background, from 3D Builder and 3D Viewer (who needs that?) to the Xbox Console Companion and the Xbox Game

Bar (which I also never use). After rebooting, turning off most of these background applications will have just one effect: Your computer will be faster. Those unneeded background apps will drain a laptop computer's battery, waste bandwidth on any computer that's attached to the internet, and needlessly consume system resources.

There's an option at the top of the list to turn off all background applications. That's not a good idea because Edge (if you use it), OneNote, and some other applications will work more efficiently if you allow them to run in the background. Most applications don't need to though so you can turn them off. Turning off the background application doesn't change the way the application runs when it has focus. About the only background process I load is Windows Security.

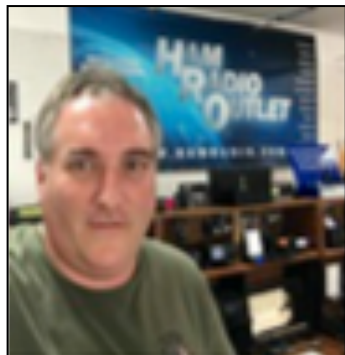


TUNING INTO THE WORLD OF AMATEUR RADIO PODCASTS

Welcome back. This is part 2 of my review, of some of my favorite Amateur Radio podcasts. I will give you a brief summary of my next



three favorite podcasts. What I like the most about these next upcoming shows is that they are basically created by individual hams that work hard on bringing this information to you and they love the

hobby. No big corporate or network companies behind them. These guys do most of the work themselves.

Let's start the next review with one of our local hams here in Florida.

Ham Radio Concepts. The man behind this great podcast is Eric Hofer, callsign is KJ4YZI. After reading his bio off his website it looks like we both found the radio hobby the same way. Our Dad's both had a CB radio in the car and that is what piqued our interest when we were just young lads.



Ham Radio Concepts, HRC for short, has a very impressive number of videos on YouTube. There you can find Eric showing us some of the latest radio gear that has come out. While in other videos he will interview people from some of the top manufacturers of amateur radio gear.

Eric has recently started shooting videos on how to get into amateur radio satellites. After watching his videos about satellites, it got me interested and I went out and picked up an Arrow antenna just like most of the Sat-chasers use. Another set of videos that he did was the "Learning the HF Ham bands". Each video was an introduction to every HF band that we can use. What the privileges were and what modes of operation are popular. For the newly licensed ham or recently upgraded ham this is very informative.

I had the chance to meet Eric at this year's Dayton's Hamvention. We did not get to talk long, but I did get to say hello and thank him for putting all his time and energy into HRC. I am looking forward to catching him at the next big hamfest. He did make a bunch of videos of his time at Xenia, Ohio. The show's website is

Now over to the west coast and we have recently found a Podcaster out of southern California. Josh Nass KI6NAZ aka "Hoshnasi". He also runs his video podcasts out of the



house. Josh has a long list of videos available. There are many categories to his videos that can be useful. A couple that I recently watched was "Get your Technician license", "Emergency Communications", "Are you new to radio?" In addition, he also has a set of videos on how to

get your General and Extra class license. Josh has done a numerous number of videos on new operating modes, interviews with ARRL Division directors, and some kit building.



Recently he did a live stream titled “Build a Micro uBitX All Mode All Band HF Ham Radio”. It was great! Like a lot of his streams Josh is on the camera as well as in the chat room interacting with his audience.

David Casler KE0OG hosts a show called “Ask Dave”. Well before I talk about his podcasting, I must give him a thumbs up on his work that he does to his website. <http://dcasler.com/>.



Dave's site provides a lot of information about amateur radio. Guides for all Amateur Radio Licenses can be found on the front page. The site is very user interactive. You can leave comments on anything that is posted to the pages.

In one of his latest videos Dave breaks down the 2-meter band. He goes into great detail to

explain why we have band plans. Dave then talks about the modes of operation and what frequencies are specifically assigned for each mode. This is no text book explanation, he makes it simple to understand. If you have been in the hobby for 30 years or 30 minutes you will come out learning something new after watching this and many of his other videos.

Product reviews and unboxing videos is another great value that Dave adds to the ham radio community. I have seen him put together various antennas and test out some new radios. Not all the reviews are great. He says it like it is.

Well that about wraps up my review of my top 5 Podcast shows. It looks like there are new shows coming on-line all the time. So, keep an eye or ear out for them. I would like to leave a couple of links to other shows that are popular in the amateur radio podcasting world. Please go check them out and subscribe.

This class concluded with a test session, on the afternoon of the 16th, with a grand total of 22 newly licensed amateur radio operators.

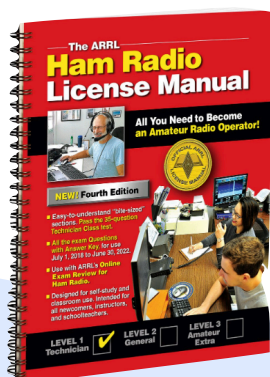

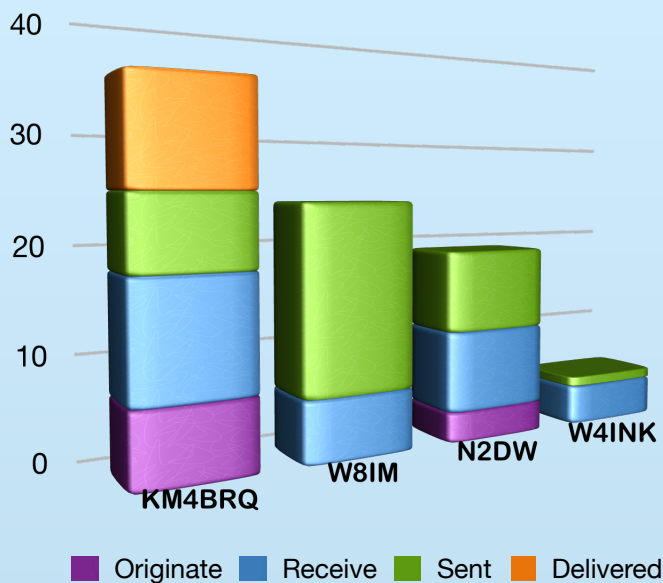

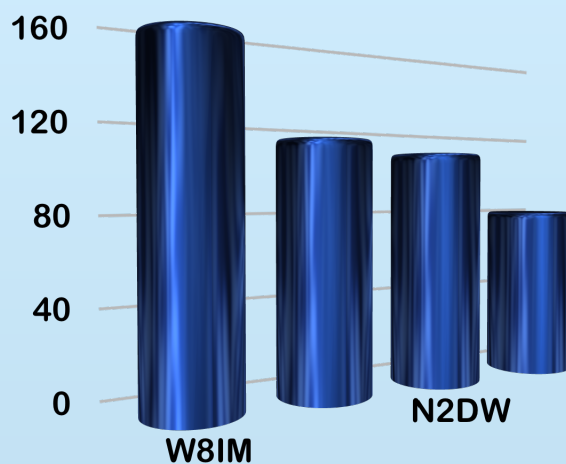

COUNTY PARKS ON THE AIR STILL UNDERWAY THROUGH THE END OF 2019

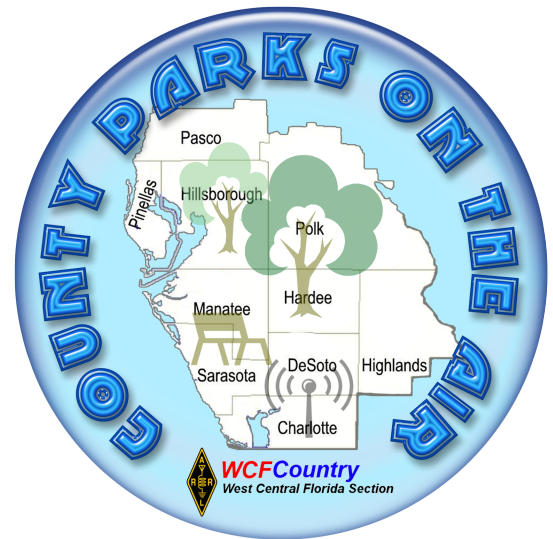

Please send that information one week or more in advance of your planned activation.

We are working a Facebook plug in for the Section website so you can see the latest CPOTA postings as well. There will be a WCF SECTION PRESS RELEASE to announce when that is complete.

The purpose for the County Parks On The Air Facebook page is:



- (1) For activators to register their intent to activate a county park on a certain date, time, bands, modes, and or frequencies they intend to operate upon.
- (2) Post pictures of activations either in progress or recently completed.
- (3) Show pictures of stations and or related equipment used for an activation or planned activation.
- (4) Share general statistics from a recent activation or a chase to share his statistics of operation.

Anyone may post to the Facebook page but we ask that everyone keep your posts civil and without any obscene, indecent, or profane language. Any posts that violate these rules will be removed by a page administrator. We thank everyone for their understanding on this matter.

CLUB HIGHLIGHT OF THE MONTH - WEST CENTRAL FLORIDA GROUP

This month we will cover one of our regional organizations. The West Central Florida Group (also known as WCFG) is a regional organization and not a traditional local radio club. The primary purpose of WCFG is to operate the NI4CE Repeater System that consists of six repeaters (five 70 centimeter and one 2 Meter) at five different sites: Holiday, Riverview, Lake Placid, Bartow, and the original site at Verna.
