

# MIKE SPRENGER W4UOO IS AWARDED THE AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE TO SCOUTING AWARD

The ARRL Amateur Radio Service to Scouting Award has been awarded to Mike Sprenger W4UOO. Sprenger, who resides in Valrico in



Hillsborough County, is an Extra Class amateur radio operator first licensed in 1992 at the USF Radio and

Electronics Club and himself achieved Eagle Scout rank in 1982.

Sprenger serves as an Assistant Scoutmaster in BSA Troop 686, currently teaches Radio Merit Badge, and is a member of the Tampa Amateur Radio Club and the K2BSA Amateur Radio Association. Combining a lifelong interest in space and NASA, operating highlights include applying for and operating a successful Shuttle Amateur Radio Experiment (SAREX) 2m radio contact with Dr. Ronald Parise WA4SIR/SK aboard STS-67 in 1995 from the South Florida Museum / Bishop Planetarium enabling 11 middle school students to ask Dr. Parise questions about life in space.

Sprenger has served on staff at two BSA National and one World Scouting Jamboree, which include operating the 2013 National Scouting Jamboree and facilitating a 2 Meter ARISS contact enabling Scouts to speak with Major Luca Parmitano KF5KDP about life aboard the International Space Station.

At the 2019 World Scouting Jamboree, Sprenger operated the NA1WJ telebridge connection to ON4ISS enabling the ARISS contact for 16 Scouts to talk to Astronaut & Scoutmaster Drew Morgan KI5AAA aboard the ISS.

In his professional career, Sprenger works as a Production and Digital Event/Webcast strategist and in his spare time can be found enjoying the pace of an Florida AM group QSO with a Hallicrafters SX-43 receiver, that belonged to his uncle Ken Wise who originally held the callsign of W4UOO and is now a silent key, and is using a BC-610 transmitter for the ultimate reclined armchair QSO. Sprenger is also active in his church technology ministry, and plays the bass guitar.

The Amateur Radio Service to Scouting Award was officially established through a resolution that the ARRL Board adopted at its 2013 Annual Meeting. It builds on the long relationship between the BSA and ARRL that began with the development of the Wireless Merit Badge in 1918 and is today Radio Merit Badge. The League's award recognizes radio amateurs who, as registered Scouting leaders, make a significant contribution to give Scouts a memorable experience with Amateur Radio.

On September 28th TARC members provided communications support for the first time to the 2nd annual "Battle of the Bridges" rowing regatta held along the Intracoastal

Waterway (ICW) in Venice.

Nineteen TARC club members and two volunteers from the Sarasota Emergency Radio Club (SERC) volunteered their time, equipment, and expertise to provide 2 -way radio communications between the seven referee/ safety boats on the course and the three shore stations at the start, finish, and

boat launch ramp locations.

provide local
repeater
service along

the race course. With the one unfortunate exception of the two boats located at the start line, we achieved excellent communications for stations along the entire 5,000 meter length of the race course. The race course provided a number of technical challenges for effective VHF/UHF line-of-sight

communications: below grade water level of the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) itself, three major turns along the ICW race course, and three drawbridge structures between those turns.



Despite the late start to the pre-race meeting at the boat launch ramp, and the less than perfect comms with boats 6 and 7 at the start line, all the participants had a great day out on the water or along the shore. Most of us had never seen, let alone participated in, a row- ing regatta event.



Space limits the listing of all volunteers; but 3 of them deserve to be singled out for recognition. Jim, KJ4NDO had the hardest job as Race Central, and was required to coordinate not only all the radio traffic from the race, but also maintained liaison with the USCG and the launch ramp operations staff.

Well done, Jim, and a special thank you! Frank, W2XYZ and Tom, W4IEE donated the use of their dual band mobile radios used for



the repeaters, and they invested a large number of hours, weeks, and days before the race to work out all the little details of positioning antennas

and radios at the VHS stadium to make our support of the event possible. They then manned the repeaters during the race as



control operators. [And a special thank you to Paul, KN4BAR for masterminding the whole affair - San Yoder, K3SY.]

Nothing is ever perfect and our first experience with this event proved that.



There were lots of lessons learned about organizing and briefing operators before the event; about the "real" location of the start line, and handling the mid-day shift change of operators. This message is a courtesy announcement to all Florida


amateur radio emergency and disaster operators regarding an upcoming national MARS exercise. MARS leadership encourages you, in your leadership role, to freely and liberally disseminate the following throughout your sphere of influence (ARES, RACES, radio clubs, etc.)

The exercise will take place during November and emphasize "...a high level of coordination with amateur radio...and facilitate amateur radio stations reception of a digital 60 meter DoD broadcast."

Messages of interest to the amateur radio community will be broadcast from WWV. In particular, amateur radio participation will take place November 16-17 2019. This participation will include reception of HF messages, interactivity with MARS stations on 60 meters, HF nets and local VHF/UHF nets.

MARS stations will identify themselves with MARS call signs on 60 meters. All contacts on other amateur frequencies will be using their amateur call signs. The primary exchanges between MARS and amateur stations will be County Status Reports. MARS stations may contact amateur

stations and request information concerning local infrastructure.



EXAGGERATED, OR SIMULATED INFORMATION SHOULD BE TRANSMITTED.

Broadcasts transmitted on 60 meters and from WWV will utilize digital mode M110A. These broadcasts will be of interest to amateur radio operators interested in participating in the exercise.

Software (MS-DMT) is available to the amateur radio community for decoding of M110A. MS-DMT is available for download with installation information at <a href="http://www.n2ckh.com/">http://www.n2ckh.com/</a> MARS ALE FORUM/MSDMT.html.





#### **COUNTY PARKS ON THE AIR STILL UNDERWAY THROUGH THE END OF 2019**


