## 12th Annual TECHCON - How It Started and What Is It About?

Some may be asking, what is TECHCON? TECHCON is the annual technical conference for the ARRL West Central Florida Section. When I became the 3rd Section Manager for the ARRL West Central Florida Section in January 2015, I felt there was a need for an annual technical conference for our ARRL

Section. So I started the ARRL West Central Florida Section Technical Conference and patterned the conference after the former ARRL/TAPR Digital Communications Conference (which sadly came to an end in 2022) because it was such a good structure. Originally it was called the ARRL West Central Florida Section Technical Conference, but I realized that the name was verbose. In 2017, I renamed it simply TECHCON, which is short for Technical Conference.

The 12th Annual TECHCON will be held at the Hillsborough County Public Safety Operations Complex, located at 9450 E. Columbus Dr., on the east side of Tampa, off of Falkenburg Road and not far from I-75.

If you plan to attend, please register online at the TECHCON Registration Page at the ARRL West Central Florida Section website. We plan again this year to have two program tracks, and once again will be video recording these presentations. Russ Delaney N4RTD, one of our Assistant Section Managers, will take these video recordings, add the presenter slides in post-production edition, and then post the finished product on the Section YouTube Channel for viewing which is located at <https://www.youtube.com/@arrlwcf>.

We used to try to do a dual in-person/virtual type

TECHCON, but the logistics simply proved to be too difficult to manage and starting last year, we now record only the presentations, and then put them on the Section YouTube channel.

The night before TECHCON, we have a Friday Evening Social at a local restaurant. This is open for anyone interested in attending. We are close to finalizing a venue for the Friday Evening Social and we will announce that via a WCF SECTION PRESS RELEASE very shortly.

Between the morning and the afternoon sessions, we will have a 1 1/2 hour break for lunch. This gives adequate time for discussion about products and ideas between the morning and afternoon session, and for anyone going off site to have lunch.

Again this year, we will order pizza in for those who wish to participate, so they can dine in and not have to go anywhere between the morning and afternoon sessions. We take up a small collection, to pay for the cost of the pizza. We have been doing this at TECHCON since 2020 and it has been very popular. Alternatively, you can bring your own lunch or dine out locally.

The topics presented at TECHCON are entirely up to the presenter. The presenters are very enthusiastic about their topics and that is why they make such good

presentations. We have openings for presenters. Each presentation slot is 50 minutes in length and we usually dedicate one time slot to what we call "Lightning Talks", which are presentations that are usually 5 to 15 minutes in length.

Each year we try to move TECHCON to a different venue in a different part of the Section. We have mostly used emergency operations centers as the venue, because they are available at no charge, and being the Section budget is not substantial enough to rent a venue. If a venue is available to us at no cost, we would be interesting in holding TECHCON there. The venue needs to have a large room, several small rooms, and a dining area or kitchen is a plus. If a club or group can arrange for access to a venue for future editions of TECHCON, please contact me via email at [kt4wx@arrl.net](mailto:kt4wx@arrl.net) and I would be glad to discuss it with you.

As the new for 2026 sponsor of the Florida State Parks on the Air Contest (FLPOTA), the Tamiami Amateur Radio Club (TARC) in Venice would like to ask all addressees of this email to please help us promote this contest to their fellow club members and friends. The contest has had a troubled history the past few years and TARC is committed to making 2026 the year that Florida amateurs get back out into our great state parks again in large numbers to compete for Parks on the Air activation recognition.

Florida will join Alabama, Georgia, and Texas in holding 2026 state POTA contests during the weekend of April 18-19, 2026. Our Florida contest will run from Friday, April 17 through Monday, April 20 during normal park hours of 8 am to 7:59 pm (or actual park closing time). We encourage clubs to use this opportunity to bring together experienced park activators and the many other club members who would like to learn about POTA operations. Plan to compete as a "club station" category contestant.



We have tried to keep the rules, number of operating classes, and scoring system to an absolute minimum. We want this to be more of a fun event and an opportunity for participants to explore our great state parks. The rules have BONUS incentives for first time activators and for youth (under 18) operators. ## Mike Lunsford KB4FHP is the 2025 Ellen White W1YL Award Recipient



On Saturday December 14, 2025, at the Tampa Bay Hamfest, during the ARRL forum, Jimmy Russ AB4KA, Section Manager, announced

that the winner of the 2025 Ellen White W1YL Award was Mike Lunsford KB4FHP.

Lunsford is serving as an Assistant Section Manager – Public Service Liaison since December 13, 2022, and is serving as the President of the Lake Wales Radio Amateurs (<https://lwra.us>) since January 2022.

Lunsford was first licensed at KN4ITQ in 2018, but had a long time interest in Amateur Radio working with several organizations, including CERT and ARES, in his professional career before retirement. After retirement, Lunsford's wife encouraged him to get a hobby and amateur radio was the obvious choice.

After getting his Technician class ticket Lunsford became quickly involved in the amateur radio community and became a member of the Lake Wales Radio Amateurs, Lakeland Amateur Radio Club, Polk County ARES, and a member of the ARRL.

In 2019, Lunsford obtained the vanity callsign of KB4FHP, inspired by his time as a volunteer with the Florida Highway Patrol Auxiliary, upon upgrading to General class. Lunsford currently serves as an ARRL Technical Specialist for digital voice modes.

Lunsford in his professional career was employed by Polk County Fire Rescue for 40

years and retired as a Battalion Chief over Special Operations, which included Office of Professional Standards, specialized response units, special events, and law enforcement liaison. Lunsford also dealt with the Public Information Office section from Polk County Fire Rescue and other agencies on a daily basis. Lunsford was the 451st person to hold a paramedic license in the State of Florida, and has maintained his license even in retirement.

Lunsford also volunteered for 35 years as a Florida Highway Patrol Auxiliary State Trooper and retired with the rank of Major. Lunsford also owns a part time business, since 1981, doing electronics and two-way radio installations in law enforcement, fire, and EMS vehicles.

Lunsford's other interests are participation as a coach for Special Olympics, as his son is an athlete, for Bocce, Golf, Bowling, and being active at his church, First Baptist Church in Lake Wales, as a ministry volunteer.


